- 4. Formal Office Referral with After School Detention (Mr. Parker)

MIDDLE SCHOOL UNIFORMS: Middle School students must adhere to all uniform policies stated within the student handbook. Students will also be checked by school staff during homeroom. We want to respect the expression of our students, but must guarantee that there will be no distraction in the learning environment. The most common violations are: no belt, polo shirts untucked, non-uniform hoodie, and distracting socks or shoes. We appreciate that our parents are the 1st line of success in adherence to these guidelines.


Pre-ARRANGED EXTENDED ABSENCES: Classroom instruction is vital to your student's success at BLRA. When students miss school, they are missing out on crucial information on their path to success. If you are planning an extended absence for a period of time, please fill out a pre-arranged absence form at the office. Your student will then be required to distribute that form to all of their teachers for perspective assignments and teacher signatures. Please be aware that since we must be responsive to our classes and their ability to master concepts, the pacing of missing work might differ slightly from what is covered in class. Assignments are due upon return!

Make-Up Work for Illness: Students that are absent due to illness are allowed two days for every day absent to complete work missed. It is the student's responsibility to obtain work from teachers **during study hall, lunch or after school – this information will not be supplied during class time.** We strongly recommend not allowing students to get too far behind on their work. Regardless of the extent of the absence, if an assignment or project has been assigned a week or more in advance, the student is responsible to have the assignment completed upon returning to school on the specified due date.
